Subject: Motion – Approval of Alcohol Use at the Pop-up Public Square in Downtown Auburn Hills

INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

This is a recommendation to City Council to consider the use of alcohol at the pop-up Public Square in downtown Auburn Hills. The city has previously allowed the use of alcohol during the Summer Concert Series, Journey to Woodstock, and Septembeerfest. There were no negative incidents or feedback on the use of alcohol at any of the noted events. For the purpose of this memo, the use of alcohol is limited to beer and wine.

In 2017, the City placed a pop-up Public Square on the surface parking lot near The DEN for events, public gatherings, etc. in downtown. Further, the pop-up Public Square was the home of the 2018 Summer Concert Series while construction of the Knight Amphitheater was underway. Due to the capacity limitations placed on restaurants and bars during the COVID-19 pandemic, staff has again moved forward with rolling out the pop-up Public Square to encourage patrons to order takeout/delivery from our downtown establishments and enjoy the Public Square as an additional seating area. The Department of Public Works staff has also set picnic tables in front of The DEN for additional outdoor seating.

With City Council approval, patrons would be permitted to bring their own packaged beer and/or wine to the Public Square and adjacent seating area near the DEN, meeting the requirements of the City ordinance. Alcohol consumption would be limited to the highlighted area from 12:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Sunday – Thursday and 12:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday. Temporary signs noting the hours of operation and the requirements of packaged beer and/or wine only will be installed. The proposed duration for the use of alcohol at the pop-up Public Square is from June 9, 2020 through September 7, 2020.

Staff will be seeking approval from the Tax Increment Finance Authority Board of Directors for the procurement of additional seating in the popup Public Square at their June 9 meeting.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that City Council allow the consumption of alcohol (beer and wine only) in the designated areas as shown from June 9 through September 7.

Subject: Motion – First Reading of Ordinance Amendment to Require Screening of Non-traditional

Recreational Vehicles and Certain Boats

INTRODUCTION AND HISTORY

For years now, past and present City Council's have struggled with the storage of recreational vehicles on residential properties located within the City. Some residents desire unlimited ability to store one or more units on their property while other residents object to such storage and find them to be unsightly and a nuisance. Dating back as far as 2006, the topic of how to address these units has been discussed, both formally and informally. Our own code enforcement staff is called upon by complainants from time to time to address such storage, often having to inform residents that such storage is permitted. In some cases, the storage of recreational vehicles of various kinds are simply left to deteriorate, with grass and weeds growing up underneath and around them and becoming an attraction to rodents and other animals.

It is not uncommon for the number of complaints regarding recreational vehicles being stored on properties to increase this time of year as some residents bring them to their homes for storage from off-premise locations or when the snow melts and they become more noticeable to residents of the community.

To address the unsightly nature of some of these recreational vehicles and to mitigate the intrusion of these stored units on neighboring properties, particularly units that have been modified beyond their original manufactured appearance and use; and to address the unsightly nature of boats that are in a dilapidated and/or state of disrepair, the attached amendment to Article V – Nuisances, of Chapter 34 – Environment, of the Auburn Hills City Code, as amended, is presented for City Council's review and consideration. With the addition of Section 34-159 as attached hereto, a requirement to screen non-traditional recreational vehicles and certain boats will be required.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that City Council accept on first reading the proposed ordinance amendment adding a new section 34-159 as attached.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE V – NUISANCES, OF CHAPTER 34 – ENVIRONMENT, OF THE AUBURN HILLS CITY CODE, AS AMENDED, TO ADD A NEW SECTION 34-159 TO REGULATE NON-TRADITIONAL RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND CERTAIN BOATS IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS.

THE CITY OF AUBURN HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.

Article V – Nuisances, of Chapter 34 – Environment, of the Auburn Hills City Code, as amended, is hereby amended to add a new Section 34-159 – Screening of non-traditional recreational vehicles and certain boats, to read as follows:

Section 34-159. – Screening of non-traditional recreational vehicles and certain boats.

All licensed and operable non-traditional recreational vehicles, including, but not limited to, converted busses, converted trucks and converted trailers shall only be parked and/or stored in the rear yard of residential property on an approved improved surface and shall be screened from the view of adjacent properties. All licensed and operable boats that are in a dilapidated and/or state of disrepair shall only be parked and/or stored in the rear yard of residential property on an approved improved surface and shall be screened from the view of adjacent properties. The City shall prepare and provide to requesting property owners a list of acceptable screening methods. Any person violating any provisions of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and costs of prosecution, by imprisonment of no more than 90 days, or by both such fine and costs and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section 2.

Article V – Nuisances, of Chapter 34 – Environment, of the Auburn Hills City Code of Ordinances, as amended, is hereby amended to delete Sections 34-159 – Reserved.

Section 3. Repealer.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 4. Severability.

If any section, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be declared to be unconstitutional, void, illegal or ineffective by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such section, clause or provision declared to be unconstitutional, void or illegal shall thereby cease to be a part of this Ordinance, but the remainder of this Ordinance shall stand and be in full force and effect.

Section 5. Savings.

All proceedings pending and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred at the time this Ordinance takes effect are saved and may be consummated according to the law when they were commenced.

Section 6. Effective Date.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect upon publication in the manner prescribed by the Charter of the City of Auburn Hills.

Section 7. Adoption.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the City Council of the City of Auburn Hills at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the _____ day of ______, 2020, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by the Charter of the City of Auburn Hills.
