WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

The term domestic violence is used when there is a close relationship between the offender and the victim. This includes: partners and ex-partners, immediate family members, other relatives and family friends. There are many forms of violence.

Domestic violence is not a family matter, it is a crime.

Usually, domestic violence is perpetrated by men against women; however, females may exhibit violent behavior against their male partners.

- Approximately 5% of male victims are killed by their intimate partners.
- Each year, approximately 500,000 women are physically assaulted or raped by an intimate partner compared to 100,000 men.
- Three out of 10 women are stalked, physically assaulted, or raped by an intimate partner, compared to one out of every ten men.

Although women are the most common victims of domestic violence, it is important to understand that men may also be victims and should be evaluated if there are indications present.

Domestic violence is a misdemeanor punishable by up to 93 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine.

Remember – forty percent of domestic violence victims never contact the police. If you or someone you love is a victim of domestic violence, call your local police. **If there is immediate danger dial 9-1-1.**

PUBLIC PROTECTION CLASSIFICATION

The Auburn Hills Fire Department has been awarded an improved Public Protection Classification 2 rating from The Insurance Service Office (ISO). The improvement from the 2018 Class 3 rating to the new Class 2 rating is effective April 1, 2023. The improved rating reflects professional excellence by Auburn Hills Firefighters and Command Staff to make our community a safer place to live and work.

ISO representatives completed a comprehensive analysis of our department's structural fire suppression delivery system which included evaluating fire department effectiveness, community risk reduction, water supply, and communications systems. Current ISO data shows only 2% of Michigan Fire Departments and 6% of fire departments across the nation have achieved the Class 2 rating or better.



According to ISO, the Public Protection Classification (PPC) plays an important role in the underwriting process for insurance companies. Most U.S. insurers use PPC classifications as part of their rate-setting process. Property owners are encouraged to contact insurance carriers and review potential price savings for 2023 and beyond.

The department would like to thank Mayor McDaniel and City Council, City Manager Tanghe, our residents, and business community for the unwavering support which allows the Auburn Hills Fire Department to deliver fire protection that is among the best in the nation.

SOLICITORS

Solicitors going door-to-door selling or taking orders for goods, merchandise, etc. must obtain a permit from the City Clerk's Office. If approved, the Clerk's Office will provide each solicitor with an approved solicitor badge and a copy of the "Do Not Knock" list. The solicitors are not allowed to solicit to the business and residential addresses registered on the "Do Not Knock" list.

Please note that not all solicitors are subject to this ordinance. Exempted solicitors include scout troops, religious groups, and some charitable organizations and political groups protected by the U.S. Constitution.

MAINTAIN A HEALTHY LAWN MOW HIGH, RECYCLE CLIPPINGS

- Mow at least three inches high
- Return clippings to recycle nutrients
- Sweep or blow clippings from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Taller grass will discourage weeds and promote deeper roots, helping the lawn survive droughts

BE SMART WITH FERTILIZER

- Be patient in the spring wait until May to fertilize
- Don't fertilize if the ground is frozen or saturated with water
- Choose lawn fertilizers with low or no phosphorus (the middle number) and follow the directions
- Confirm spreader setting before applying
- Don't fertilize or discharge clippings near lakes, rivers, streams or storm drains
- Sweep fertilizer granules from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Wash your spreader on the grass

WATER REMINDERS

- Watering should not produce puddles. Lighter, more frequent watering is best
- Brown lawns are OK; dormancy is a natural response to drought; however, some water may be necessary in a drought of more than a month

SUMMER CAR **MAINTENANCE**

Washing cars in your driveway can add pollutants to our waterways. Wash water that enters storm drains often contains detergents, oil, grease, heavy metals, and dirt. Vehicle fluids dumped down a storm drain or directly into a waterway can cause serious problems. The amount it takes to fill your automobile's engine can form an eight acre oil slick in a river. Other vehicle fluids are poisonous to people, fish, and wildlife.

WASHING TIPS

- Wash your car at commercial carwashes that use water efficiently and dispose it properly
- Remove dirt around wheels first with a wire brush.
 Collect the soil with a broom and dispose of it in a manner that will keep it out of storm drains
- Use non-phosphate biodegradable detergents and mild soaps, such as vegetable oil-based soaps
- Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse it quickly using a pistol grip nozzle with high pressure and low volume

MAINTENANCE TIPS

- If you change vehicle fluids at home, take the waste fluids to a recycling center or an oil change facility
- Always use a drip pan under your work and use funnels when transferring fluids
- Never mix waste oil with gasoline, solvents or other liquid
- Change vehicle fluids in the garage whenever possible
- If a spill occurs, pour kitty litter, saw dust or cornmeal on spill to absorb the liquid. Place the waste material in a strong plastic bag and dispose of it with your trash

ONLY RAIN In the drain

Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. Oil, pet waste, leaves, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and streams. With almost five million people living in Southeast Michigan, we all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains. Remember, only rain in the drain!

Here are some simple steps you can take to help keep pollutants out of storm drains and keep our water clean.

To report pollution, call the City of Auburn Hills Community Development Department at 248-364-6900.



Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead to our lakes and streams.



Volunteer to label storm drains in your neighborhood to inform residents that storm drains flow directly to our lakes and streams. Encourage citizens to contact their local community for more information on storm drain stenciling programs.



Pick up after your pets! Pet waste contains bacteria that are harmful to us and our water. Leaving it on the sidewalk or lawn means the bacteria will be transported into the storm drains, and then into our lakes and streams.

ZERO PERCENT RATE INCREASE?

As we begin 2023, Auburn Hills residents and businesses may be doing a double take at their water and sewer bill, noticing that we have the same rates (if not lower) as 2022! It's not a mistake, as the City has been able to keep the rates stagnant this year. The annual CPI index was up 7.1% last year, and ranged from 6-13% depending on the sector (food, energy, etc.) Everywhere you turn, costs of living are pinching all consumers. I especially noticed the pain recently on my natural gas bill, which is used to heat my residence and my water. Trying to keep rates stable through a period like this seems like an impossibility!

Each year, the City of Auburn Hills embarks on an in-depth review of all the factors that are considered when setting water and sewer rates for our customers. That procedure involves reviewing the costs associated with operation and maintenance, future large capital projects, staffing costs, equipment costs, and so forth. These factors only affect the City of Auburn Hills. However, there are many other factors that are considered when determining these rates. The Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) and Oakland County Water Resources Commission (OCWRC) also have their own list of factors and concerns that affect their budget, which influences the rate that the City pays for the wholesale services. As you can see, the elaborate process is necessary to arrive at proper water and sewer rates for our customers.



In the past two years, the Water and Sewer Department has replaced infrastructure and improved operations which have directly affected the budget. Replacing old leaky water mains, valves, and inaccurate water meters are appearing to have a large impact on our bottom line. Unmetered water is common, but you want to limit it as much as possible. Making sure the amount of water that comes into the City closely matches what leaves the city throughout all the endpoints is key. We have reduced that "loss" or un-metered water quite a bit over the past few years, which has been a boost to the budget. Improved account management has also been put into effect, which is limiting errors and issues surrounding billing.

Being fiscally responsible is at the forefront of all decision-making throughout the City and is continually stressed from City Manager down. It is also part of our mission statement and reinforced by Council City when they set goals for all Departments. As I look around, I see communities and utilities raising their rates by as much as double digit increases, which makes me proud of what we have been able to accomplish here! I hope our residents and businesses know that we have their best interests in mind all the time, and won't increase charges unless absolutely necessary.

Enjoy the same fresh water in 2023... free from inflation.

NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse.

KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM
