### CRISIS OUTREACH

The Co-Response (CORE) Crisis Outreach Program is a partnership between law enforcement and mental health professionals to better serve the communities of Auburn Hills, Birmingham, Bloomfield Township, and Rochester. The four agencies came to a mutual agreement with the Oakland Community Health Network (OCHN) to contract a full-time mental health clinician to work within the community. The clinician co-responds along with police to people in crisis in the community, to meet them where they are, provide additional resources, de-escalate situations/behaviors, and provide proactive follow-up.

The program launched in September of 2021 with the assistance of a \$75,000 grant from the Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan to hire one full time clinician and then expanded to a second full time clinician in June of 2023 with the assistance of a \$260,000 grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

To date the CORE program has served over 1,500 people in the four communities. Has conducted 40-hour Crisis Intervention Team training to over 200 officers in Oakland County, many of which are from Auburn Hills. This program has been so successful that the team is presenting it to other professional organizations, who are using it as a model to set up programs in their communities. This initiative has helped launch programs in Pontiac, Troy, Waterford, Royal Oak, Ferndale, and Madison Heights.

## AUBURN HILLS FIRE DEPARTMENT **PARAMEDICS**

Auburn Hills Firefighters spend thousands of hours each year training to be best prepared for the emergencies they will encounter in serving our residents. Our firefighters are required to become certified through the State of Michigan Bureau of Fire Services in firefighting as well as through the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services as licensed Paramedics so that they are best prepared to meet the needs of the community.

Our firefighters must complete 200+ hours of training and become certified as an Emergency Medical Technician before enrolling in a paramedic program. The paramedic curriculum is rigorous and covers a wide range of topics in emergency medicine and trauma. It requires a thorough knowledge of anatomy and physiology, patient assessment, diagnoses, and treatments. A paramedic must be well versed in pharmacology, cardiology, respiratory illnesses, pediatrics, trauma, and more. A paramedic student must complete more than 1,200 hours of coursework and clinical rotations before being eligible for the national examination. The paramedic textbook alone is well over 1,000 pages!

Currently 30 of our 40 firefighters have received paramedic licensure and an additional six are attending paramedic programs from one of several certified education programs in the region. Once certified and licensed as paramedics, our firefighters are not only trained to handle critical emergencies such as strokes, heart attacks, or traumatic injuries, but are also expected to manage interpersonal and social aspects of managing emergency scenes. Paramedics must be highly effective with technical skills but also exercise strong emotional intelligence to help victims navigate extremely stressful moments in their lives.

### VOTING OPTIONS

Registered voters now have three different options to vote in upcoming elections.

#### NINE DAYS OF IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING

#### VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Early voting is similar to how you would vote at your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the early voting site.

- Location (one location for all voters): Public Safety Building, Community Room, 1899 N. Squirrel Rd.
- **Dates:** Begins on the second Saturday before the election and ends on the Sunday before the election.
- **Hours**: 8:30 AM 4:30 PM each day, except for the Thursday before the election which will be from noon 8:00 PM.

Absentee voting allows you to complete your absentee ballot at home or at the Clerk's Office.

Return your absentee ballot:

- In person to one of the Drop Boxes located inside City Hall.
- The outside Drop Box located in Parking Lot 2 or the Drop Box attached to the building at City Hall, 1827 N. Squirrel Road.
- The outside Drop Box located in the parking lot at the DPW Facility, 1500 Brown Road.
- By mail using the prepaid postage envelope.

(Absentee ballots returned by using one of the above methods will have a team of election inspectors process these ballot at the Absentee Voter Counting Board on Election Day).

- Return your ballot to the early voting site during the nine-day early voting period and you can personally insert it into the tabulator at the early voting site.
- Return your ballot to the precinct on Election Day and you can personally insert it into the tabulator at the precinct.

### SOLICITORS

Solicitors going door-to-door selling or taking orders for goods, merchandise, etc. must obtain a permit from the City Clerk's Office. If approved, the Clerk's Office will provide each solicitor with an approved solicitor badge and a copy of the "Do Not Knock" list. The solicitors are not allowed to solicit at the business and residential addresses registered on the "Do Not Knock" list.

Please note that not all solicitors are subject to this ordinance. Exempted solicitors include scout troops, religious groups, and some charitable organizations and political groups protected by the U.S. Constitution.

### REMINDERS FROM ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT

With summer around the corner, the ordinance enforcement team would like to offer a few reminders to make sure everyone can enjoy the sunshine your way this year.

Our officers are here to help! Community engagement is the number one way we gain compliance. If you receive a letter from one of our ordinance officers, please feel free to give them a call to discuss any concerns.



City ordinance requires grass and weeds to be maintained at a height below eight (8) inches throughout your entire property from May 1st through October 15th. If your summer plans take you out of town for an extended period, ensure your grass is cared for!



Don't let April showers bring ordinance officers knocking. Parking and driving on the lawn are not allowed. With spring rain softening the ground, use extra caution if traveling on the lawn.



RV season is upon us. If you have an RV trip planned this summer, remember that RVs can only be parked in the driveway for 48 hours to load and unload. Parking or storing your RV between trips? Be sure it's parked legally by reviewing Section 1813-2 of the Auburn Hills Zoning Ordinance.

### ONLY RAIN In the drain

Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. Oil, pet waste, leaves, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and streams. With almost five million people living in Southeast Michigan, we all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains. Remember, only rain in the drain!

Here are some simple steps you can take to help keep pollutants out of storm drains and keep our water clean.

To report pollution, call the City of Auburn Hills Community Development Department at 248-364-6900.



Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead to our lakes and streams.



Volunteer to label storm drains in your neighborhood to inform residents that storm drains flow directly to our lakes and streams. Encourage citizens to contact their local community for more information on storm drain stenciling programs.



Pick up after your pets! Pet waste contains bacteria that are harmful to us and our water. Leaving it on the sidewalk or lawn means the bacteria will be transported into the storm drains, and then into our lakes and streams.

Once solidified, the container can be disposed of in regular household garbage. Please help us defray the cost of paying a hazardous waste collection vendor for disposal of water-based paints.

#### FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM (All Ages)

The File of Life is a paper emergency information system sponsored by the Auburn Hills Fire, Police and Recreation and Senior Services Departments. The File of Life is a magnetic file that is placed on the front of the refrigerator. Inside the file is emergency information that first responders may need to access in case of a medical emergency. This is a free program. Stop by the Community Center to pick up a File of Life or call 248-370-9353 to schedule a trained volunteer to visit you and help you complete your File of Life information.

#### RESIDENTIAL ROPER LOCKBOX SAFETY PROGRAM (All Ages)

Participants in this program will have a secure lockbox installed on the exterior of their home which contains a key to the home. Only the Auburn Hills Fire Department personnel will have a master key to unlock this box to gain secure entry into the home in the event of an emergency. Roper boxes can be purchased at cost through the Recreation and Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for lowincome residents.

#### **KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)**

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

#### TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Not available for work-related transportation. The fee is \$2.00 each way. For information call: 248-370-9353. Must call in advance; same-day service is not available.

#### NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse. If you suspect elder abuse or neglect, call 1-855-444-3911. You do not need to leave your name.
