MODERNIZING FOR SAFETY AND EFFICIENCY

Over the past 20 years, the fire department has transitioned from a paid on-call to a full-time fire department that operates from our three strategically located stations. Full-time personnel and part-time personnel rotate work with three shifts each working 24 hours at a time. The existing stations were not designed for 24-hour staffing and have been adapted as best possible to accommodate overnight crews. As with most communities, the department continues to see a steady increase in call volume and increased demand for our responders. As the working model for firefighters has evolved, the design and layout of our fire stations grows increasingly obsolete and in need of modernization.

Recognizing the need to modernize the fire stations, fire department leadership began working on conceptual plans for Stations 1 and 3 in 2021. In early 2022 Redstone Architects was awarded the contract to design modernizations of those two stations.

In January 2023, Fire Department Administrative Staff moved from Station 2, which is in the Public Safety Building on the municipal campus into a new administrative building. The purpose of this move was to allow for the modernization of Station 2. The Spicer Group was awarded the design contract for Station 2 in 2023 and worked concurrently on the design and layout. The purpose of the modernization projects and focus of design work was to improve service delivery, productivity, and working conditions. Station designs incorporated decontamination and isolation of carcinogens through a hot, warm, and cold zone model that will help reduce cancer risk for firefighters.

The Fire Department is excited to see this project begin and looks forward to all three stations' service delivery and productivity, as well as the well-being of the firefighters, to dramatically improve. Fire Department staff are excited to see this project through and appreciate the support from the City Council, the City Manager's Office, and of course our residents for providing us with facilities that will help us improve service delivery in our community.

SOLICITORS

Solicitors going door-to-door selling or taking orders for goods, merchandise, etc must obtain a permit from the City Clerk's Office. If approved, the Clerk's Office will provide each solicitor with an approved solicitor badge and a copy of the "Do Not Knock" list. The solicitors are not allowed to solicit to the business and residential addresses registered on the "Do Not Knock" list.

Please note that not all solicitors are subject to this ordinance. Exempted solicitors include scout troops, religious groups, and some charitable organizations and political groups protected by the U.S. Constitution.

REMINDERS FROM ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT

With summer around the corner, the ordinance enforcement team would like to offer a few reminders to make sure everyone can enjoy the sunshine their way this year.

Our officers are here to help! Community engagement is the number one way we gain compliance. If you receive a letter from one of our ordinance officers, please feel free to give them a call to discuss any concerns.



City ordinance requires grass and weeds to be maintained at a height below eight (8) inches throughout your entire property from May 1st through October 15th. If your summer plans take you out of town for an extended period, ensure your grass is cared for!



Don't let April showers bring ordinance officers knocking. Parking and driving on the lawn are not allowed. With spring rain softening the ground, use extra caution if traveling on the lawn.



RV season is upon us. If you have an RV trip planned this summer, remember that RVs can only be parked in the driveway for 48 hours to load and unload. Parking or storing your RV between trips? Be sure it's parked legally by reviewing Section 1813-2 of the Auburn Hills Zoning Ordinance.

Latex paint/water-based paint not accepted because these are not considered hazardous waste products. Latex paint can be solidified by opening the container and letting it dry, or using an absorbent such as sand or kitty litter. Once solidified, the container can be disposed of in regular household garbage. Please help us defray the cost of paying a hazardous waste collection vendor for disposal of water-based paints.

ROAD WORK PROJECTS

As another winter begins to wane, the annual joke appears—there are only two seasons in Michigan: Winter and Road Construction. In many ways the joke is true. The City of Auburn Hills owns and maintains 180 lanemiles of road, with major roads having an average lifespan of 20 years and local roads lasting about 30 years. This means approximately seven miles of roads need reconstruction each year.

In 2025, the City is planning the following projects:

- Birchfield/Patrick Henry Road Reconstruction and Utility Upgrades
 - Birchfield Road (Reconstruction and Water & Sewer upgrades in 2025)
 - Patrick Henry Road (Reconstruction and Water upgrades in 2026)
- TIFA-B Road Improvements
 - Executive Hills Blvd (Full reconstruction, road diet, and pathway installation in 2025)
 - Centre Rd & Innovation Dr (Full reconstructions in 2026)
- Tienken Rd, Shimmons Circle Reconstruction & N Squirrel Road Mill & Pave
 - Tienken Rd & Shimmons Circle (Reconstruction)
 - N Squirrel Rd (Mill and pave from Dutton Rd south)
- Butler Road Reconstruction & Stormwater Upgrades
- North Squirrel Rd Concrete Panel Replacements
 - Walton Blvd to M-59
- New traffic signal
 - N Squirrel Road and Shimmons Road

Before construction begins, town hall meetings will be held for the first three projects listed above. Adjacent property owners and associations will be notified by mail once the construction contracts are awarded. For updates, visit auburnhills.org

GUIDELINES FOR HOME RAIN GARDENS

1. Select a Rain Garden Location Which Intercepts Stormwater Runoff

- Near a downspout
- In a front yard swale NOTE: Municipal approval needed for rain gardens in a public easement

2. Determine Rain Garden Size and Shape

- Map where rainwater flows and collects
- Start small...you can expand the garden in the future

3. Check Your Soils for Drainage

• Read SOCWA brochure for a simple drainage test

4. Select a Rain Garden Soil Mix

- For poorly drained sites, 70% compost and 30% sharp sand is recommended
- Do not use purchased top soil





5. Plant the Rain Garden

- Use native wildflowers and shrubs suited to the site
- Label your plants and keep records
- See www.socwa.org for recommended plant species

6. Mulch the Rain Garden

• Use a natural organic mulch spread in a 2 inch layer

• Refresh the mulch annually

7. Maintain the Rain Garden

- Weed, edit, divide, and replant as needed
- Edge the garden twice per year to keep grass out

ONLY RAIN In the drain

Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. Oil, pet waste, leaves, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and streams. With almost five million people living in Southeast Michigan, we all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains. Remember, only rain in the drain!

Here are some simple steps you can take to help keep pollutants out of storm drains and keep our water clean.

To report pollution, call the City of Auburn Hills Department of Public Works at 248-391-3777.



Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead to our lakes and streams.



Volunteer to label storm drains in your neighborhood to inform residents that storm drains flow directly to our lakes and streams. Encourage citizens to contact their local community for more information on storm drain stenciling programs.



Pick up after your pets! Pet waste contains bacteria that are harmful to us and our water. Leaving it on the sidewalk or lawn means the bacteria will be transported into the storm drains, and then into our lakes and streams.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM (All Ages)

The File of Life is a paper emergency information system sponsored by the Auburn Hills Fire, Police and Recreation and Senior Services Departments. The File of Life is a magnetic file that is placed on the front of the refrigerator. Inside the file is emergency information that first responders may need to access in case of a medical emergency. This is a free program. Stop by the Community Center to pick up a File of Life.

RESIDENTIAL LOCKBOX SAFETY PROGRAM (All Ages)

Participants in this program will have a secure lockbox installed on the exterior of their home which contains a key to the home. Only the Auburn Hills Fire Department personnel will have a master key to unlock this box to gain secure entry into the home in the event of an emergency. Lock boxes can be purchased at cost through the Recreation and Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for low-income residents.

KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Not available for work-related transportation. The fee is \$2.00 each way. For information call: 248-370-9353. Must call in advance; at least 48-hour notice is required. Same-day service is not available.

NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt,

having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse. If you suspect elder abuse or neglect,

call 1-855-444-3911. You do not need to leave your name.
