Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Graduation

On August 30th, seventeen area residents graduated from a forty-hour training course to become qualified to respond to assist with large scale disasters or events. This is the first CERT team to exist in Auburn Hills.



Armed Robbery & Felonious Assault

On August 11th, officers were dispatched to MJ Diamonds inside Great Lakes Crossing Outlets for two males who had pepper sprayed the store staff before breaking jewelry cases with hammers and escaping with merchandise. Video review and Flock cameras showed the suspect vehicle, including the license plate, which lead the investigation to the suspects.

The four suspects, all adult males, were captured on August 24 by members of the FBI Oakland County Gang & Violent Crime Task Force after they did a similar type robbery in Troy.

Crime and Service Statistics

We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.



Year to date we have experienced a 1% increase in Part A incidents (more serious offenses), a 0% increase in Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and a 6% increase in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service-related incidents) compared to 2022.

Calls for Service



Officers handled 2029 calls for service during August. Year to date the department has handled 16,994 calls for service, which is a 5% increase compared to 2022.



In August, Officers spent 455 hours in our neighborhoods. Officers spend time in neighborhoods proactively patrolling, conducting traffic enforcement, and engaging with our residents.



Year to date we have spent 3194 hours in our neighborhoods, which is a 6% increase compared to 2022.

Financial Reports

We continually analyze our department expenditures to ensure we remain within our approved budget, while delivering the best possible service to our community.



During August, we received \$54,378 in revenue. Year to date we have received \$9,531,840.



During August, we expended \$830,953. Year to date we have expended \$8,695,256 or 86% of our approved budget. We are currently \$1,335,128 under budget as of the end of August 2023.

Department Overtime



Officers worked a total of 524 hours of overtime in August. This is a cumulative year to date increase in overtime of 1220 hours compared to this same time last year.
