#### **Vehicle Stabilization Training**

#### 02/10/2024

AHFD continually trains to sharpen their skills and prepare the first responders for any number of situations that may occur. Personnel recently trained on vehicle stabilization, practicing new techniques that can



be used with existing equipment. These new techniques are used when a patient needs to be removed from a crash scene on an overturned vehicle, but the vehicle is too unstable to cut apart or place firefighters nearby. The new technique takes around two minutes to fully stabilize a vehicle and make it safe to cut and remove a patient. The old system would take up to 15-20 minutes to set up.





## Classroom Visit

02/28/2024

Fire Department personnel paid a visit to 4- and 5-year-old students at the Lowry Center for Early Education. Firefighters shared safety tips with the children, and the students were shown how to stay low and crawl under "smoke" and look for exit signs.



They also practiced "Stop, Drop and Roll". Then the firefighters raced against the students to dress in fire gear. Of course, the students won!



## Commercial Structure Fire

Auburn Hills Fire was called to reports of a structure fire on the morning of February 29. Engine 1 crew arrived at the large golf dome and, upon entry, found the structure filled with light smoke and the smell of burning plastic. Facility personnel were attempting to put the fire out with fire extinguishers. Firefighters were able to completely extinguish the fire with a water can. Inside the dome, the crew noticed that fire had burned a hole approximately 10 feet wide by 6 feet in height. Other on scene units utilized their water cans to ensure all fire was out and to cool down any remaining hot spots. No overhaul was necessary, and no extension was observed beyond the original fire area.
