#### Vehicle Fire 8/26/2024

C shift crew responded to a call for a semi-trailer on fire on I-75. Personnel arrived to find the rear of the trailer flatbed loaded with mortar, on fire. The tires on the truck were also on fire. The crew extinguished the fire with tank water from from Ladder 2. Bloomfield Township provided mutual aid in the form of additional water from their ladder. The uninjured driver told first responders that he was flagged down by a passerby, letting him know his trailer was on fire.



Residential Fire
8/30/2024



Firefighters on A shift were called to a residential fire with a victim trapped. Heavy smoke conditions were noted upon arrival. The victim was instructed to go to his room and open the window. Ladder 2 personnel were able to rescue the victim using a ladder to his bedroom window. The victim stated he woke up and smelled smoke, opened his bedroom door and saw flames. He immediately called 911. The fire occurred in a second-floor apartment where the living room suffered heat damage and there was smoke damage located throughout the rest of the apartment. The kitchen was the origin of the fire, as determined by Inspectors Solomon and Toss. The cause of the fire remains undetermined. Several surrounding apartments were smoke and water damaged. Two family pets were rescued, but one cat was found deceased.
