<u>Car vs House</u> 5/11/2024



Auburn Hills Fire was called with a reported gas leak at a residential property. When Ladder 2 arrived, the crew found a car had crashed into a house, breaking the gas meter. Firefighters were able to turn off the gas below the meter to stop the leak. The gas company was called to confirm there were no underground leaks. A board-up company was brought in to stabilize the wall that had been knocked down. No injuries were reported.



Residential Fire 5/11/2024

The Fire Department was dispatched for a residential structure fire. Upon arrival, there was light smoke showing from beneath the mobile home. The homeowner reported everyone was out of the home and attempted to put out the fire with a garden hose. Rescue 2 and Engine 1 used a 1 ³/₄ line to completely extinguish the fire. The crews removed the skirting from the trailer to check for hot spots. The interior of the home was inspected for extension, but noted only light smoke on the interior, which was then ventilated and cleared. All units cleared and returned to service.

Explosion in Rochester

The fire department responded to a mutual aid call of an explosion in downtown Rochester City. A propane tank outside of a business on Main Street caught fire and exploded according to Rochester Police. Police and Fire from Rochester, along with neighboring fire departments, responded to the explosion. Several people were injured and taken to nearby hospitals. The cause is considered accidental.

> Dumpster Fire 5/24/2024



AHFD was toned for a dumpster fire in the parking lot of an apartment complex. Ladder 2 arrived to find a dumpster, approximately 30-40 yards in volume, with an active fire burning inside. Firefighters began extinguishing the blaze with hydrant water using Ladder 2. It appeared the dumpster contained construction materials that had ignited, but no damage was reported to the apartments.
