

Re: Disabled Veterans Exemption

Per PA 161 of 2013, Disabled Veterans who meet the eligibility requirements, own and occupy their property as their homestead and **ANNUALLY** file the proper affidavit and support documents are 100% exempt from paying property taxes.

Eligibility –

- 1. A Veteran who is disabled as a result of a military service-related injury or condition and meets at least one of the criteria below:
 - a. VA determined that they are entitled to veterans benefits at the 100% rate.
 - b. Certificate from VA that disable veteran receives pecuniary (monetary) assistance for specially adapted housing.
 - c. VA rated disabled veteran as individually unemployable.
- 2. The Veteran owns and occupies their property as their principal residence (A Principal Residence Exemption Affidavit must be on file with the Assessor's office).
- 3. The Veteran was honorably discharged.

<u>Application</u> – owner must file with the assessor <u>ANNUALLY</u> between Tax Day (December 31) and the final adjournment of the March Board of Review:

- Affidavit supplied by assessor
- 2. Proof of Honorable Discharge
- 3. Letter or certificate from the Veterans Administration:
 - a. That the VA has determined owner is permanently and totally disabled as a result of military service and entitled to veterans benefits at the 100% rate.
 - i. Awards Letter from VA. States the percentage of disability.

or

- ii. Commissary Letter specifically states that person is 100% disabled due to service-connected disability.
- b. The VA certifies that owner is receiving or has received pecuniary (monetary) assistance due to disability for specially adapted housing.
- c. VA rated owner as individually unemployable. (Would also have an Awards or Commissary Letter.)

<u>Surviving Spouse</u> – is also eligible for the exemption as long as he/she provides same documentation on an <u>ANNUAL</u> basis and <u>remains unmarried</u>. In addition to the above requirements, you will also need to provide a copy of your marriage certificate.
