Residential Fire

8/23/2025

Dispatch called A-shift for a residential structure fire. Upon arrival, Engine 3, Ladder 2 and Captain 1 found a working fire in a small, single-story home. All residents and pets were safely outside the home. Smoke and fire were present on the back deck and the basement was full of smoke, but the thermal imaging camera showed no heat. Engine 3 and Ladder 2 together fought and extinguished the fire. Ventilation and salvage/overhaul were then performed. No injuries were reported.
