

CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The Auburn Hills Police Department's mission is to continually improve the safety and quality of life within our community through a broad base of traditional and innovative services, while protecting constitutional and basic human rights. Members of this department will at all times stand accountable for their conduct.

The Citizens Police Academy was designed to give our community an idea of how the Police Department takes our mission and applies it to the relationship we strive to have with the community on a daily basis.

The Auburn Hills Police Department is currently seeking interested candidates who would like to participate in the Citizens Police Academy. The academy is designed to give the applicant a better working knowledge of the Police Department's personnel and operations.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Citizens Police Academy is a FREE program designed to give attendees an interactive, hands-on guide through the complexities of police work and an in-depth view of the Auburn Hills Police Department.

Attendees will learn the "whys" and "hows" of policing by working through a simulated criminal case from beginning to end. The class is limited to 20 students.

TOPICS WILL INCLUDE:

- The police hiring process
- Police in-service training and legal standards
- Use of Firearms, Tasers, and Use of Force Rules
- Shoot/don't shoot scenarios
- Evidence gathering and documentation
- Major crash investigations
- Traffic stops and investigations
- Police tactical procedures
- Police Chaplain Program

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

You must be at least 18 years of age and live, work or attend a religious institution or college within the City of Auburn Hills to be eligible.

WHEN WILL ACADEMY SESSIONS BE HELD?

Sessions are Thursday evenings from 6:00 - 9:00 PM, beginning on September 11th and ending on November 6th. Applicants should make sure they are able to attend all sessions - **there is no cost to attend**, and dinner will be provided during each session.

FIRE DEPARTMENT **UTILITY VEHICLE** TO ENHANCE EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The Auburn Hills Fire Department has expanded its emergency response capabilities with the recent purchase of a Kubota RTV-X1100 utility vehicle. This versatile and rugged Utility Terrain Vehicle (UTV) is designed to assist firefighters and paramedics during special events, off-road emergencies, and severe weather situations.

The UTV offers a fully enclosed cab, four-wheel drive, and a strong suspension system. It will be paired with the department's new multi-purpose skid unit to carry essential firefighting and medical equipment into areas that are difficult to reach with larger fire apparatus.

The skid unit incorporates a 50-gallon water tank, high-pressure pump, hose reel, and storage for essential firefighting tools and emergency medical equipment. It is ideal for fighting small brush fires, managing outdoor events, and providing support in our parks, trails, and wooded areas.

Community Benefits:

- **Improved Access:** Allows firefighters to respond more effectively in areas with limited access, such as crowded downtown events, parks, trails, and wooded spaces.
- Faster, Safer Response: Helps shorten response times and improves safety for both residents and first responders. Ideal for large public gatherings, providing a quick-response presence without obstructing foot traffic or crowd movement.
- **Versatile Use:** Supports fire suppression and emergency medical response in challenging environments and terrain where larger fire apparatus cannot.
- **Increased Safety:** Helps protect community members and property by enabling rapid containment of small fires before they grow.

Don't be surprised if you see this new unit at events throughout the year in the City. Come say, "hello," if you do!

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2025

Confirm Voter Registration & Location of Precinct

Log on to michigan.gov/vote to confirm that you are registered to vote and the location of your precinct.

Registering to Vote

You may register to vote by mail, at the City Clerk's Office, County Clerk's Office or any Secretary of State office up to 15 days prior to an election.

You may register in person at the City Clerk's Office within 14 days of an election, up to and including Election Day. If registering within the final 14 days, you must show proof of residency, in addition to proof of identity. (Proof of residency includes a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document containing the applicant's name and current address.)

All Michigan voters must use the same residential address for voter registration and driver's license.

VOTING **OPTIONS**

Three Days of In-Person Early Voting

Early voting is similar to how you would vote at your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the early voting site.

- · Location (one location for all voters): Public Safety Building, Community Room, 1899 N. Squirrel Rd.
- Dates and hours:

Friday, October 31st 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM Saturday, November 1st 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM Sunday, November 2nd 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM



Voting by Absentee Ballot

Absentee voting allows you to complete your absentee ballot at home or at the Clerk's Office. You can then submit your ballot in the envelope by mail, in person, or by drop box. After an absentee ballot is received by the Clerk's Office, your absentee ballot is processed and tabulated by election officials on Election Day.

- Drop Box Locations: Inside City Hall, In Parking Lot 2 at City Hall, attached to the outside of the City Hall building, in the DPW Parking Lot.
- You may also return your absentee ballot, in person, to your precinct or to the early voting site and then you can personally insert the ballot into the tabulator at that location.

Voting In-Precinct on Election Day

Voting in person, in your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the precinct.

- Polls are open from 7:00 AM 8:00 PM on Election Day.

The City of Auburn Hills and Oakland County residents are urged to follow prevention tips to protect themselves from mosquito-borne diseases. Some diseases that are spread by mosquitoes include West Nile virus, Zika virus, St. Louis Encephalitis (SLE), Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE), and LaCrosse (LAC) virus. The best way to prevent diseases spread by mosquitoes is to avoid being bitten.

FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO PROTECT YOU AND YOUR FAMILY:

PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

- Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent. All EPA-registered insect repellents are evaluated for safety and effectiveness.
- Always follow the product label instructions.
- Do not use insect repellent on babies younger than two months of age.
- Do not apply insect repellent on a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cut or irritated skin.
- Adults: spray insect repellent on your hands and then apply to a child's face.
- Wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Avoid areas where mosquitoes may be present, including indoor areas.

CONTROL MOSQUITOES AT HOME

- Maintain window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of buildings. Do not prop open doors.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by removing standing water in and around your home.
- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, roof gutters, or trash containers.

FALL **CLEANUP**



Residential yard waste will be retrieved through the second full week of December. Please be sure to set out any yard waste on your regularly scheduled pickup day through December 12th. Please continue to use paper yard waste bags or properly marked bins, up to 95-gallons in capacity. Branches up to three inches in diameter and four feet in length can be bundled together if the bundles are less than 18 inches around and less than 100 pounds.

WATER OUALITY OREPORT

The Auburn Hills Department of Public Works is required to publish an annual Water Quality Report. This report contains details regarding the quality of your drinking water as well as helpful tips in conservation of water.

HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

For one day a year, the Department of Public Works (DPW) partners with a company that specializes in the proper recycling, treatment and/or disposal of hazardous waste. The event is held exclusively for Auburn Hills residents (with proof of residency) at the DPW off Brown Road. This year's event was held on May 10th and was a huge success.

In total, we had residents deliver over 28,227 pounds of hazardous waste! The most common materials that were dropped off were electronic devices (16,930 pounds), household batteries (2,568 pounds), automotive fluids (2,581 pounds), toxic products (1,529 pounds), and oil-based paints and solvents (1,000 pounds). Pesticides (560 pounds), pharmaceuticals (60 pounds), propane and fire extinguishers (852 pounds), fluorescent light bulbs (485 pounds), and aerosols (370 pounds) were also dropped off, among other items.

The next Household Hazardous Waste Day will happen sometime in Spring 2026. Once the exact date is determined, the DPW will publish the date on the City's website. The information will also be shared on social media and the insert that accompanies the utility bill that is distributed the month prior to the event.

Thank you for doing your part in protecting our water supply, air, and soil by properly disposing of hazardous waste.





LEAF BURNING **PROHIBITED EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2025**

On Monday evening, March 17, 2025, City Council adopted an ordinance prohibiting the burning of yard waste within city limits. The ordinance became effective on June 1, 2025.

This initiative is driven by our commitment to:

- Improving Air Quality: Leaf burning releases harmful pollutants into the air, impacting respiratory health and overall well-being. Leaf smoke can irritate the lungs and trigger asthma attacks, especially for children and seniors.
- Protecting the Environment: Smoke from leaf burning contributes to air pollution and can negatively impact local ecosystems.
- Ensuring Compliance with State Law: Michigan State Law prohibits the open burning of yard waste or leaves in any municipality having a population of 7,500 or more (MCL Section 324.11539).

As a reminder, our contracted waste hauling service, Priority Waste, provides curbside leaf collection weekly from April 1 through the second full week of December. Residents may use paper yard waste bags or containers up to 95 gallons in capacity with a proper sticker facing the street (100-pound weight limit). Other alternatives to open burning include composting leaves and grass clippings, or using leaves and grass clippings for mulch.

If you are a senior citizen or disabled homeowner who needs help raking leaves, volunteers in our Rake and Run

program will clean and rake yards for eligible residents, as volunteer availability allows. Call (248) 370-9353 to have your name placed on an interest list.

While the city is taking steps to eliminate leaf burning for improved air quality, it's important to note that recreational outdoor wood burning will still be permitted under specific guidelines. These regulations ensure safety by requiring wood burning to take place in approved units like fire pits or chimineas with dry and seasoned firewood. Can I make payments at the Treasurer's counter?

You can make payment for the following items in person at the Finance/Treasurer office:

- Utility bills
- Property taxes
- Special Assessments
- Dog Licenses (January June 1)

We accept all forms of payment (cash, check, credit or debit card*) in person. For over-the-phone payments, call 866-446-1189.

*Fees apply for all credit and debit card payments and a photo ID must be presented at time of payment.

How do I pay my utility bill?

Payments by check can be mailed or dropped in the secure drop box at City Hall. Checks dropped into the payment box are considered paid on the NEXT City business day.

REMEMBER: Water payments must be on a separate check from other payments, which includes tax payments, special assessments, etc.

Payments can be made by credit/debit card or e-Check by using our Online Utility Bill Payment Service at auburnhills.org/onlinepayment.

Can I pay my bill through Direct Debit?

Utility Billing customers are encouraged to utilize the Direct Debit Service to stay current on utility bills.

You can sign up for direct debit at auburnhills.org under 'Pay Bills & Tickets.' To register an account, click utilities and enter in your water account number and then click register customer.

How can I look up my property tax bill?

To look up your property taxes, please create an account with BSA Online. You can find the instructions on creating an account by following BSA Online Account Instructions at bsaonline.com/Account/Register.

When are summer property taxes due?


2025 Summer Taxes can be paid July 1, 2025 to September 15, 2025 without interest. Payments must be received in the Treasurer's Department by 5pm Monday, September 15, 2025. NO POSTMARKS ACCEPTED.

When are winter property taxes due?

2025 Winter Taxes can be paid from December 1, 2025 through February 16, 2026 without interest. Payments must be received in the Treasurer's Department by 5 PM Monday, February 16, 2026. NO POSTMARKS ACCEPTED.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM (All Ages)

The File of Life is a paper emergency information system sponsored by the Auburn Hills Fire, Police and Recreation and Senior Services Departments. The File of Life is a magnetic file that is placed on the front of the refrigerator. Inside the file is emergency information that first responders may need to access in case of a medical emergency. This is a free program. Stop by the Community Center to pick up a File of Life.

RESIDENTIAL LOCKBOX SAFETY PROGRAM (All Ages)

Participants in this program will have a secure lockbox installed on the exterior of their home which contains a key to the home. Only the Auburn Hills Fire Department personnel will have a master key to unlock this box to gain secure entry into the home in the event of an emergency. Lock boxes can be purchased at cost through the Recreation and Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for low-income residents.

KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Not available for work-related transportation. The fee is \$2.00 each way. For information call: 248-370-9353. Must call in advance; at least 48-hour notice is required. Same-day service is not available.

NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse. If you suspect elder abuse or neglect, call 1-855-444-3911. You do not need to leave your name.

DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOAN CLOSET

Durable medical equipment such as walkers, crutches, wheelchairs & bath stools are available. Availability of equipment varies. Because our storage space is limited, we ask that you call prior to bringing in any donations. Cannot accept any medications or medical supplies.




THOMAS A. TANGHE CITY MANAGER
