CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The Auburn Hills Police Department's mission is to continually improve the safety and quality of life within our community through a broad base of traditional and innovative services, while protecting constitutional and basic human rights. Members of this department will at all times stand accountable for their conduct.

The Citizens Police Academy was designed to give our community an idea of how the Police Department takes our mission and applies it to the relationship we strive to have with the community on a daily basis.

The Auburn Hills Police Department is currently seeking interested candidates who would like to participate in the Citizens Police Academy. The academy is designed to give the applicant a better working knowledge of the Police Department's personnel and operations.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Citizens Police Academy is a FREE program designed to give attendees an interactive, hands-on guide through the complexities of police work and an in-depth view of the Auburn Hills Police Department.

Attendees will learn the "whys" and "hows" of policing by working through a simulated criminal case from beginning to end. The class is limited to 20 students.

TOPICS WILL INCLUDE:

- The police hiring process
- Police in-service training and legal standards
- Use of Firearms, Tasers, and Use of Force Rules
- Shoot/don't shoot scenarios
- Evidence gathering and documentation
- Major crash investigations
- Traffic stops and investigations
- Police tactical procedures
- Police Chaplain Program

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

You must be at least 18 years of age and live, work or attend a religious institution or college within the City of Auburn Hills to be eligible.

WHEN WILL ACADEMY SESSIONS BE HELD?

Sessions are Thursday evenings from 6:00 - 9:00 PM, beginning on September 10th and ending on November 5th. Applicants should make sure they are able to attend all sessions - **there is no cost to attend**, and dinner will be provided during each session.

FIRE DEPARTMENT OUTREACH

Residents may have noticed plenty of activity around the Auburn Hills Fire Department this year, from major improvements at our fire stations to educational programs in schools and businesses throughout the city.

One of the department's most significant accomplishments was the completion of the Fire Station 1 and Fire Station 3 Modernization Project. Approved by City Council in 2024, the renovations provide safer, more functional facilities for firefighters working 24-hour shifts while strengthening the department's ability to serve the community. Health and safety were central to the project, with improvements designed to reduce exposure to environmental hazards and limit the spread of contaminants brought back from emergency scenes into firefighters' living areas.



The spring and summer months also kept firefighters busy connecting with the community through public education programs, school visits, station tours, and fire truck displays. These hands-on experiences allow students to explore fire apparatus, learn important safety lessons, and see where firefighters work, train, and live while on duty. Classroom visits also give children an opportunity to meet firefighters in their protective gear, ask questions, and learn how to stay safe at home and at school.

More than emergency responders, the Auburn Hills Fire Department is proud to be part of the community—working every day to keep residents safe, informed, and supported.

ELECTION INFORMATION

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026

CONFIRM VOTER REGISTRATION & LOCATION OF PRECINCT

Log on to michigan.gov/vote to confirm that you are registered to vote and the location of your precinct.

REGISTERING TO VOTE

You may register to vote by mail, at the City Clerk's Office, County Clerk's Office or any Secretary of State office up to 15 days prior to an election.

You may register in person at the City Clerk's Office within 14 days of an election, up to and including Election Day. If registering within the final 14 days, you must show proof of residency, in addition to proof of identity. Proof of residency includes a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document containing the applicant's name and current address.

All Michigan voters must use the same residential address for voter registration and driver's license.

EXTENDED HOURS

City Clerk's Office will offer extended hours from 7:00 AM - 3:00 PM on Saturday, October 31, to accept & issue absentee ballots and for voter registration.

VOTING OPTIONS

EARLY IN-PERSON VOTING

Early voting is similar to how you would vote at your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the early voting site. Early voting is located in the Public Safety Community Room at 1899 N. Squirrel Road (one location for all voters).

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

(aka “Vote by Mail”)

Absentee voting allows you to complete your absentee ballot at home or at the Clerk’s Office. You can then submit your ballot in the envelope by mail, in person, or by drop box. After an absentee ballot is received by the Clerk’s Office, your absentee ballot is processed and tabulated by election officials.

- Drop Box Locations: Inside City Hall, in Parking Lot 2 at City Hall, attached to the outside of the City Hall building, in the DPW Parking Lot
- You may also bring your absentee ballot to your precinct or to the early voting site and then you can personally insert the ballot into the tabulator at that location.
- Absentee ballots must be turned in by 8:00 PM on Election Day, November 3rd.



VOTING IN-PRECINCT ON ELECTION DAY

Voting in person, in your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the precinct.

- Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM on Election Day.

MOSQUITO SMARTS KNOW THE BUZZ ABOUT MOSQUITO BITES

The City of Auburn Hills and Oakland County residents are urged to follow prevention tips to protect themselves from mosquito-borne diseases. Some diseases that are spread by mosquitoes include West Nile virus, Zika virus, St. Louis Encephalitis (SLE), Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE), and LaCrosse (LAC) virus. The best way to prevent diseases spread by mosquitoes is to avoid being bitten.

FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO PROTECT YOU AND YOUR FAMILY:

PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

- Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent. All EPA-registered insect repellents are evaluated for safety and effectiveness.
- Always follow the product label instructions.
- Do not use insect repellent on babies younger than two months of age.
- Do not apply insect repellent on a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cut or irritated skin.
- Adults: spray insect repellent on your hands and then apply to a child's face.
- Wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- Avoid areas where mosquitoes may be present, including indoor areas.

CONTROL MOSQUITOES AT HOME

- Maintain window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of buildings. Do not prop open doors.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by removing standing water in and around your home.
- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, roof gutters, or trash containers.

FALL CLEANUP



Residential yard waste will be retrieved through the second full week of December. Please be sure to set out any yard waste on your regularly scheduled pickup day through December 12th. Please continue to use paper yard waste bags or properly marked bins, up to 95-gallons in capacity. Branches up to three inches in diameter and four feet in length can be bundled together if the bundles are less than 18 inches around and less than 100 pounds.

2026 HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

For one day a year, the Department of Public Works (DPW) partners with a company that specializes in the proper recycling, treatment and/or disposal of hazardous waste. The event is held exclusively for Auburn Hills residents (with proof of residency) at the DPW off Brown Road. This year's event was held on May 9th and was a huge success.

In total, we had residents deliver over 29,243 pounds of hazardous waste! The most common materials that were dropped off were electronic devices (14,980 pounds), automotive fluids (3,600 pounds), oil-based paints (2,934 pounds), household batteries (2,848 pounds), and toxic products (1,855 pounds). Flammable liquids (859 pounds), propane and fire extinguishers (663 pounds), pesticides (457 pounds), aerosols (402 pounds), pharmaceuticals (133 pounds), and fluorescent light bulbs (123 pounds) were also dropped off, among other items.

The next Household Hazardous Waste Day will happen on May 8, 2027. The information will also be shared on social media and on an insert that accompanies the utility bill that is distributed the month prior to the event.

Thank you for doing your part in protecting our water supply, air, and soil by properly disposing of hazardous waste.

SHAKE YOUR BOX

This time of year, winter is likely the last thing you might be thinking about. At the Department of Public Works (DPW), we are always thinking about how things can be done more efficiently and with less impact on our residents, businesses, and visitors – that includes all seasons of operations.



While it is still warm, we would like to encourage residents and businesses to “Shake your Mailbox” if it is along the road edge. While damage is still possible, most of the time damage occurs from the snow coming off the plows and not physical impact from the plows themselves. The DPW’s policy states that the City shall not reimburse mailbox damage caused by the impact of snow alone. If your mailbox moves when shaken, it likely will not withstand standard snow-removal operations. Repairs may include tightening loose screws or replacing rotten or damaged wood. If repairs are made now, mail delivery delays may be avoided.

Mailboxes are one of the only objects allowed by law to be placed in the road right of way. The location and construction of mailboxes must conform to the rules and regulations of the U.S. Postal Service and standards established by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO). The DPW’s mailbox damage policy and claim form can be found by scanning the QR code and visiting auburnhills.org/departments/departments-of-public-works/roads.



CLINTON RIVER CLEAN UP

On April 18, 2026, the City of Auburn Hills hosted another successful Clinton River Cleanup event in partnership with the Clinton River Watershed Council. Thank you to the six community volunteers who joined our team at River Woods Park to participate in the annual cleanup. Through the hard work of the volunteers, a total of 23.5 pounds of waste was picked up from the Clinton River and surrounding area. That makes 23.5 pounds of waste that will not end up in our local waterway system!

Thank you again to all those that came out this year to volunteer their time to help our local ecosystem. Do you or someone you know want to participate in future community service projects? Stay tuned for more volunteer efforts throughout the year and mark your calendars for our next Annual Clinton River cleanup in April 2027.

Can I make payments at the Treasurer's counter?

You can make payment for the following items in person at the Finance/Treasurer office:

- Utility bills
- Property taxes
- Special Assessments
- Dog Licenses (January - June 1)

We accept all forms of payment (cash, check, credit or debit card*) in person. For over-the-phone payments, call 866-446-1189.

**Fees apply for all credit and debit card payments and a photo ID must be presented at time of payment.*

How do I pay my utility bill?

Payments by check can be mailed or dropped in the secure drop box at City Hall. Checks dropped into the payment box are considered paid on the NEXT City business day.

REMEMBER: Water payments must be on a separate check from other payments, which includes tax payments, special assessments, etc.

Payments can be made by credit/debit card or e-Check by using our Online Utility Bill Payment Service at auburnhills.org/onlinepayment.

Can I pay my bill through Direct Debit?

Utility Billing customers are encouraged to utilize the Direct Debit Service to stay current on utility bills.

You can sign up for direct debit at auburnhills.org under 'Make a Payment.' To register an account, click utilities and enter in your water account number and then click register customer.

How can I look up my property tax bill?

To look up your property taxes, please create an account with BSA Online. You can find the instructions on creating an account by following BSA Online Account Instructions at bsaonline.com/Account/Register.

To see a full breakdown of your current property taxes, past years, or more, you can head to our Property Tax Lookup database at auburnhills.org/propertytax.

When are summer property taxes due?

2026 Summer Taxes can be paid July 1, 2026 to September 14, 2026 without interest. Payments must be received in the Treasurer's Department by 5pm Monday, September 14, 2026. NO POSTMARKS ACCEPTED.

When are winter property taxes due?

2026 Winter Taxes can be paid from December 1, 2026 through February 15, 2027 without interest. Payments must be received in the Treasurer's Department by 5pm Monday, February 15, 2027. NO POSTMARKS ACCEPTED.

Can I pay my property taxes online?

To pay your taxes online, visit auburnhills.org/paytaxes. Fees do apply when paying with credit/debit card.

DOG LICENSES

2027 will be the final year that assistance with Oakland County's DocuPet dog licensing platform will be available at the City Hall Treasurer's Office. Assistance with Oakland County dog license services is available Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 4:30 PM from January 5 through May 29, 2027.

SAFE ADDRESS PROGRAM

This program is made possible thanks to a generous donation from AARP. The City of Auburn Hills Senior Services Department is providing reflective address signs that you can add to your mailboxes or homes. Improper visibility can make your home harder to find, which can have negative consequences, like slowing emergency response times. While supplies last, you must come to the community center, register, and pick up your address sign. You will receive a sign, numbers, brackets, and instructions. Assistance can be provided to those over 60+, physically challenged, or active military personnel through the SHARP program.

FILE OF LIFE PROGRAM (All Ages)

The File of Life is a paper emergency information system sponsored by the Auburn Hills Fire, Police and Recreation and Senior Services Departments. The File of Life is a magnetic file that is placed on the front of the refrigerator. Inside the file is emergency information that first responders may need to access in case of a medical emergency. This is a free program. Stop by the Community Center to pick up a File of Life or call 248-370-9353 to schedule a trained volunteer to visit you and help you complete your File of Life information.

RESIDENTIAL LOCKBOX SAFETY PROGRAM (All Ages)

Participants in this program will have a secure lockbox installed on the exterior of their home which contains a key to the home. Only the Auburn Hills Fire Department personnel will have a master key to unlock this box to gain secure entry into the home in the event of an emergency. Lockboxes can be purchased at cost through the Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for low-income residents.

KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Not available for work-related transportation. The fee is \$2.00 each way. For information call: 248-370-9353. Must call in advance; at least 48-hour notice is required. Same-day service is not available.

NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse. **If you suspect elder abuse or neglect, call 1-855-444-3911.** You do not need to leave your name.

DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOAN CLOSET

Durable medical equipment such as walkers, crutches, wheelchairs & bath stools are available. Availability of equipment varies. Because our storage space is limited, we ask that you call prior to bringing in any donations. Cannot accept any medications or medical supplies.

SHIP AGEWAYS MEDICARE/MEDICAID COUNSELING

Trained SHIP volunteers are available to answer your questions about Medicare, Medicaid, Medicare Part D Prescription programs, Long Term Care Insurance, Supplemental Insurances, Medicare Drug Discount Cards, and more. Assistance is also available in understanding statements from Medicare, hospitals, etc. By appointment only, call the Community Center for more information at 248-370-9353.

OPERATION MEDICINE CABINET
