MEDICAL RESPONSE

Each year, the Auburn Hills Fire Department responds to thousands of calls for service to keep our community safe. In 2025, our crews answered 4,628 calls. Approximately 75% were related to emergency medical services (EMS). This reflects a nationwide trend where fire departments are increasingly serving as frontline medical responders, providing critical care during medical emergencies long before patients reach the hospital.

Over the past five years, our overall call volume has grown by 11.5%. Every member of our department is prepared to deliver high-quality medical care while still maintaining readiness for fire suppression, rescues, and other emergencies. We remain committed to adapting, training, and investing in our personnel to ensure Auburn Hills residents receive fast, professional, and compassionate care whenever they need it most.

CONFIRM VOTER REGISTRATION & LOCATION OF PRECINCT

Log on to michigan.gov/vote to confirm that you are registered to vote and the location of your precinct.

REGISTERING TO VOTE

You may register to vote by mail, at the City Clerk's Office, County Clerk's Office or any Secretary of State office up to 15 days prior to an election.

You may register in person at the City Clerk's Office within 14 days of an election, up to and including Election Day. If registering within the final 14 days, you must show proof of residency, in addition to proof of identity. Proof of residency includes a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document containing the applicant's name and current address.

All Michigan voters must use the same residential address for voter registration and driver's license.

EXTENDED HOURS

For the May and August elections, the City Clerk's Office will offer extended hours on Saturday, May 2, and Saturday, August 1, from 7:00 AM - 3:00 PM to accept and issue absentee ballots and to register to vote.

VOTING OPTIONS



EARLY IN-PERSON VOTING

Early voting is similar to how you would vote at your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the early voting site. Early voting is located in the Public Safety Community Room at 1899 N. Squirrel Road (one location for all voters).

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

(aka “Vote by Mail”)

Absentee voting allows you to complete your absentee ballot at home or at the Clerk’s Office. You can then submit your ballot in the envelope by mail, in person, or by drop box. After an absentee ballot is received by the Clerk’s Office, your absentee ballot is processed and tabulated by election inspectors on Election Day.

- Drop Box Locations: Inside City Hall, In Parking Lot 2 at City Hall, attached to the outside of the City Hall building, in the DPW Parking Lot
- You may also bring your absentee ballot to your precinct or to the early voting site and then you can personally insert the ballot into the tabulator at that location.



VOTING IN-PRECINCT ON ELECTION DAY

Voting in person, in your precinct on Election Day. Voters are issued a ballot and can personally insert it into the tabulator at the precinct.

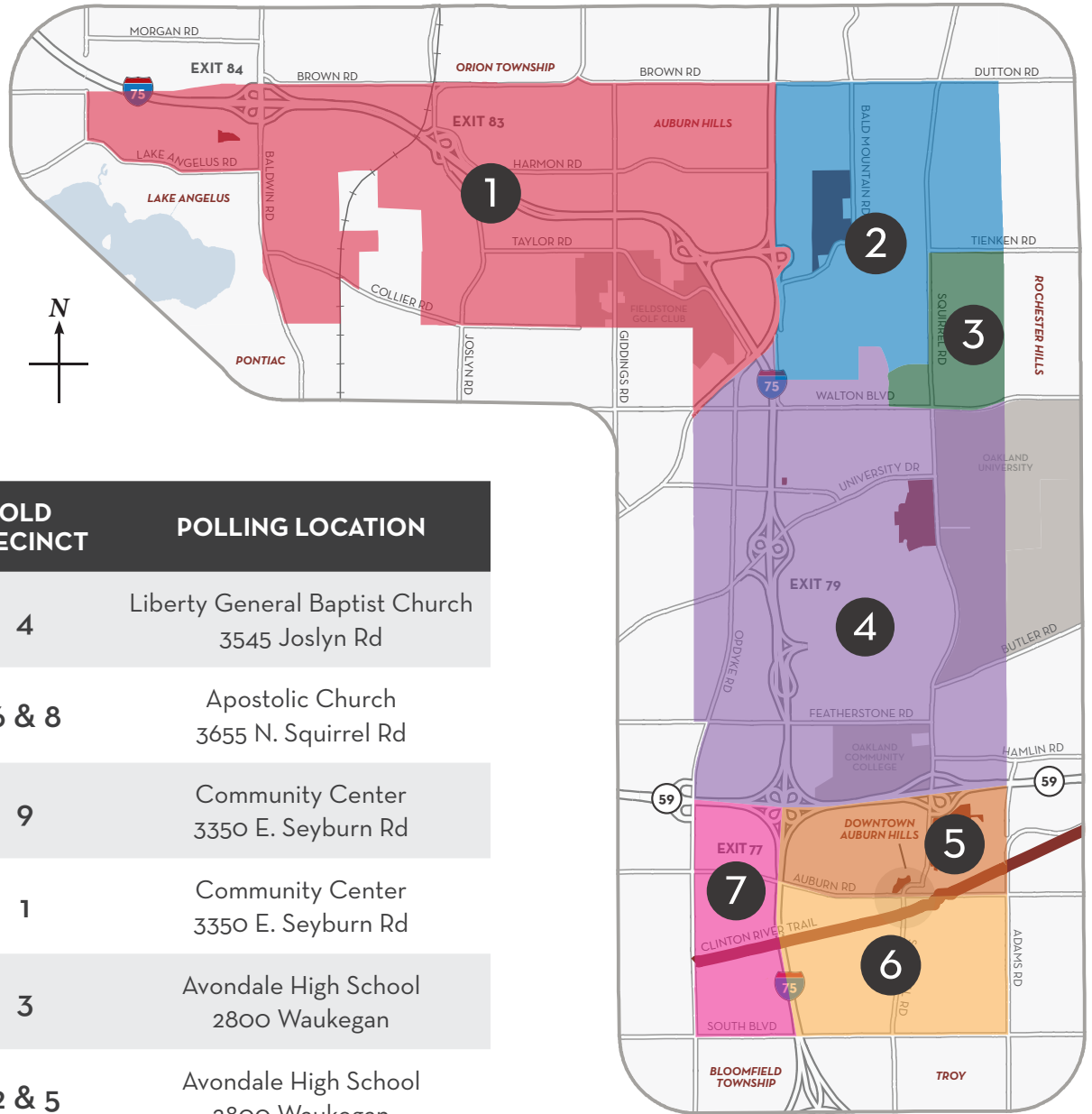
- Polls are open from 7:00 AM – 8:00 PM on Election Day.

PRECINCT CHANGES

With the passage of Proposal 22-2, the maximum number of registered voters per precinct increased from 2,999 to 4,999. To accommodate this change, the City has combined several precincts, reducing the total from nine to seven.

What does this mean for you? While your voting location stayed the same, your precinct number changed, except for the voters who previously voted at the Presbyterian Church and will now vote at Avondale High School.

These changes went into effect on January 1, 2026. Earlier this year, all registered voters received an updated Voter ID Card reflecting the new information. To double-check your registration status and find your current precinct, please visit michigan.gov/vote.

SOLICITORS

Solicitors who go door-to-door to sell goods or take orders are required to obtain a permit from the City Clerk's Office. Once approved, each solicitor will be issued an official City solicitor badge and provided with a copy of the City's "Do Not Knock" list. Solicitors may not visit any business or residential addresses that appear on this list.

Please note that not all door-to-door activity is subject to this ordinance. Certain groups are exempt, including scout troops, religious organizations, and some charitable and political groups that are protected under the U.S. Constitution.

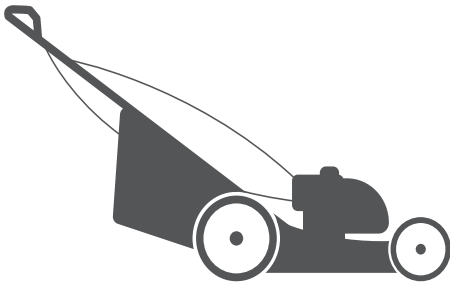

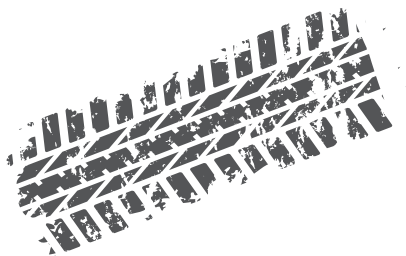
REMINDERS FROM ORDINANCE ENFORCEMENT

With summer around the corner, the ordinance enforcement team would like to offer a few reminders to make sure everyone can enjoy the sunshine their way this year.

Our officers are here to help! Community engagement is the number one way we gain compliance. If you receive a letter from one of our ordinance officers, please feel free to give them a call to discuss any concerns.



City ordinance requires grass and weeds to be maintained at a height below eight (8) inches throughout your entire property from May 1st through October 15th. If your summer plans take you out of town for an extended period, ensure your grass is cared for!



Don't let April showers bring ordinance officers knocking. Parking and driving on the lawn are not allowed. With spring rain softening the ground, use extra caution if traveling on the lawn.



RV season is upon us. If you have an RV trip planned this summer, remember that RVs can only be parked in the driveway for 48 hours to load and unload. Parking or storing your RV between trips? Be sure it's parked legally by reviewing Section 1813-2 of the Auburn Hills Zoning Ordinance.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS



Computers, televisions, microwaves, household batteries, any electronic devices



Household chemicals, solvents, moth balls, expired medications, mercury debris, cleaning products, solvent-based glue, fluorescent lightbulbs



Fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, pesticides, fertilizers, rat poison



Automotive oils, gasoline, kerosene, diesel fuels, brake fluid, anti-freeze, acid filled batteries, acid, solvents, waxes, lubricants



Solvents, oils, glues, caulking, paint thinner, turpentine, varnishes, wood preservatives, epoxy, empty propane tanks

NON-ACCEPTED MATERIALS



Latex paint/water-based paint not accepted because these are not considered hazardous waste products. Latex paint can be solidified by opening the container and letting it dry, or using an absorbent such as sand or kitty litter. Once solidified, the container can be disposed of in regular household garbage. Please help us defray the cost of paying a hazardous waste collection vendor for disposal of water-based paints.

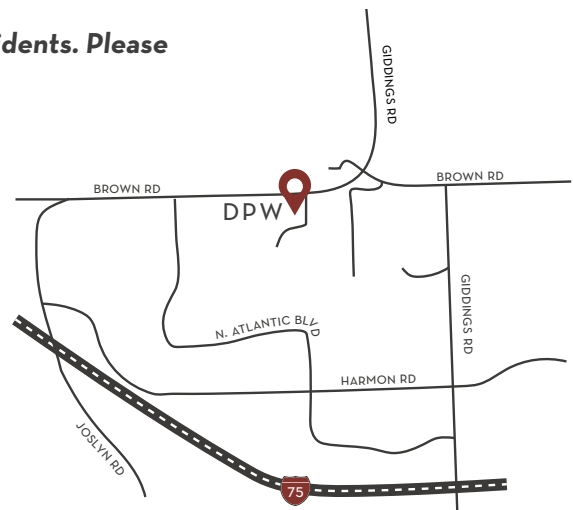

MAINTAIN A HEALTHY LAWN

MOW HIGH, RECYCLE CLIPPINGS

- Mow at least three inches high
- Return clippings to recycle nutrients
- Sweep or blow clippings from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Taller grass will discourage weeds and promote deeper roots, helping the lawn survive droughts

BE SMART WITH FERTILIZER

- Be patient in the spring - wait until May to fertilize
- Don't fertilize if the ground is frozen or saturated with water
- Choose lawn fertilizers with low or no phosphorus (the middle number) and follow the directions
- Confirm spreader setting before applying
- Don't fertilize or discharge clippings near lakes, rivers, streams or storm drains
- Sweep fertilizer granules from walks and driveways onto the lawn
- Wash your spreader on the grass

WATER REMINDERS

- Watering should not produce puddles. Lighter, more frequent watering is best
- Brown lawns are OK; dormancy is a natural response to drought; however, some water may be necessary in a drought of more than a month

CAR WASHING AND MAINTENANCE

Washing cars in your driveway can add pollutants to our waterways. Wash water that enters storm drains often contains detergents, oil, grease, heavy metals, and dirt. Vehicle fluids dumped down a storm drain or directly into a waterway can cause serious problems. The amount it takes to fill your automobile's engine can form an eight acre oil slick in a river. Other vehicle fluids are poisonous to people, fish, and wildlife.

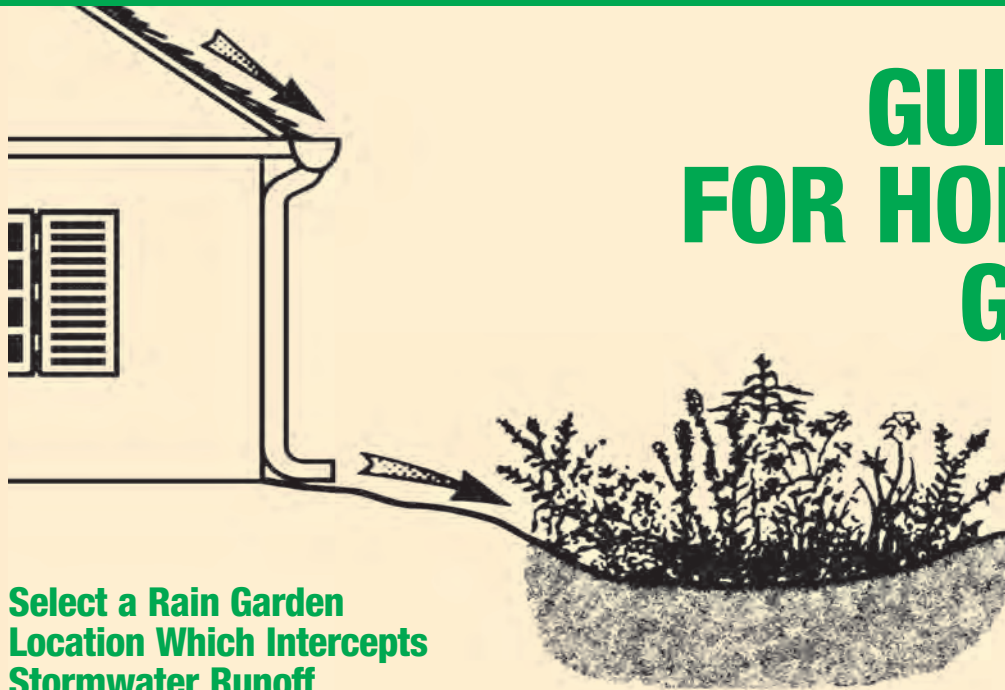
WASHING TIPS

- Wash your car at commercial carwashes that use water efficiently and dispose it properly
- Remove dirt around wheels first with a wire brush. Collect the soil with a broom and dispose of it in a manner that will keep it out of storm drains
- Use non-phosphate biodegradable detergents and mild soaps, such as vegetable oil-based soaps
- Wash one section of the car at a time and rinse it quickly using a pistol grip nozzle with high pressure and low volume

MAINTENANCE TIPS

- If you change vehicle fluids at home, take the waste fluids to a recycling center or an oil change facility
- Always use a drip pan under your work and use funnels when transferring fluids
- Never mix waste oil with gasoline, solvents or other liquid
- Change vehicle fluids in the garage whenever possible
- If a spill occurs, pour kitty litter, saw dust or cornmeal on spill to absorb the liquid. Place the waste material in a strong plastic bag and dispose of it with your trash

GUIDELINES FOR HOME RAIN GARDENS



1. Select a Rain Garden Location Which Intercepts Stormwater Runoff

- Near a downspout
 - In a front yard swale
- NOTE: Municipal approval needed for rain gardens in a public easement

2. Determine Rain Garden Size and Shape

- Map where rainwater flows and collects
- Start small...you can expand the garden in the future

3. Check Your Soils for Drainage

- Read SOCWA brochure for a simple drainage test

4. Select a Rain Garden Soil Mix

- For poorly drained sites, 70% compost and 30% sharp sand is recommended
- Do not use purchased top soil



5. Plant the Rain Garden

- Use native wildflowers and shrubs suited to the site
- Label your plants and keep records
- See www.socwa.org for recommended plant species

6. Mulch the Rain Garden

- Use a natural organic mulch spread in a 2 inch layer
- Refresh the mulch annually

No Fertilizer or Pesticides, Please!

7. Maintain the Rain Garden

- Weed, edit, divide, and replant as needed
- Edge the garden twice per year to keep grass out

ONLY RAIN IN THE DRAIN

Storm drains lead directly to our lakes and streams. Oil, pet waste, leaves, or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our lakes and streams. With almost five million people living in Southeast Michigan, we all need to be aware of what goes into our storm drains. Remember, only rain in the drain!

Here are some simple steps you can take to help keep pollutants out of storm drains and keep our water clean.

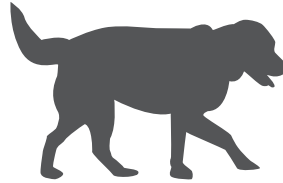
To report pollution, call the City of Auburn Hills Department of Public Works at 248-391-3777.



Do you have extra fertilizer, grass clippings, or dirt on your driveway? Sweep it back onto your lawn. Hosing your driveway sends these pollutants into storm drains that lead to our lakes and streams.



Volunteer to label storm drains in your neighborhood to inform residents that storm drains flow directly to our lakes and streams. Encourage citizens to contact their local community for more information on storm drain stenciling programs.



Pick up after your pets! Pet waste contains bacteria that are harmful to us and our water. Leaving it on the sidewalk or lawn means the bacteria will be transported into the storm drains, and then into our lakes and streams.

ENHANCED ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS

A friendly reminder, the City of Auburn Hills has an online billing and payment solution, offering more ways to view and pay your water/sewer bill, including 24/7 phone payments and pay by text. Residents can receive and view bills electronically, make a payment with credit/debit card or e-check, and choose to go paperless. A quick, one-time payment can be made without registering or you can create an account to enjoy more features like setting up automatic payments, saving payment information for later use and viewing history.



- Easy-to-use online portal to access your account and make payments
- Save time with automatic payment options:
 - AutoPay - automatically pay the invoice amount on the due date
 - Recurring Scheduled Payments - set up a schedule to pay a fixed amount or the invoice balance on a specific day of the month
- Receive email reminders when your bill is ready, when a scheduled payment is pending, and a confirmation after making a payment

Lockboxes can be purchased at cost through the Senior Services Department or contact us to see if you qualify for a limited supply of free boxes for low-income residents.

KIT - KEEP IN TOUCH PHONE PAL PROGRAM (55+)

The KIT program provides a weekly phone call to homebound seniors to give a friendly hello and have some great conversations. This phone pal program is good for seniors who live alone and would do well with a weekly phone call. Phone calls are made by trained OU Pre-Med student volunteers. This is not a substitute for personal medical alert systems. For more information and to sign up please call the Community Center.

TRANSPORTATION (60+)

Transportation available for senior city residents aged 60 and older and/or disabled city residents. Transportation is for medical appointments (non-emergency or surgical), business appointments, shopping days and visits to the Community Center for luncheon activities. Same-day service is not available.

NO EXCUSE FOR ELDER ABUSE

If you are a senior citizen or know someone who is being hurt, having money taken or used without permission, are being forced to do things against their will, are being neglected, or are unable to care for themselves, then they are suffering from elder abuse. Neglecting to care for a dependent older adult or leaving them in an unsafe situation, whether you mean to or not, is elder abuse. Knowing, and not doing anything is elder abuse. **If you suspect elder abuse or neglect, call 1-855-444-3911.** You do not need to leave your name.

DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT LOAN CLOSET

Durable medical equipment such as walkers, crutches, wheelchairs & bath stools are available. Availability of equipment varies. Because our storage space is limited, we ask that you call prior to bringing in any donations. Cannot accept any medications or medical supplies.

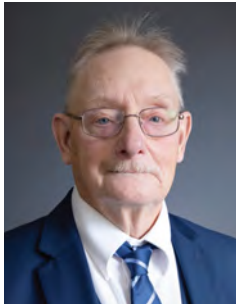
The City Council approves the annual City budget for all activities, adopts ordinances, approves rezoning and site plans, and also approves major purchases.

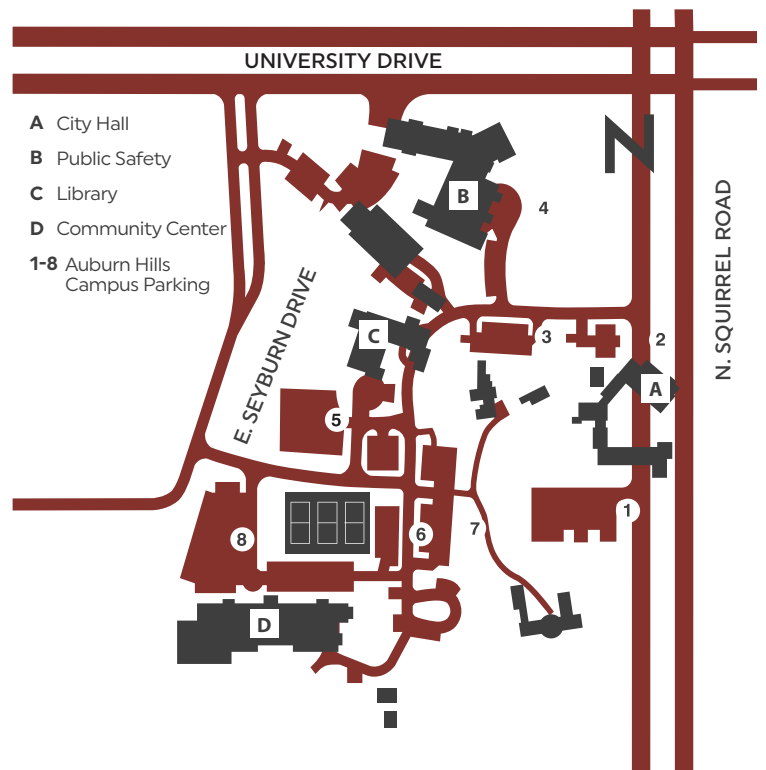
