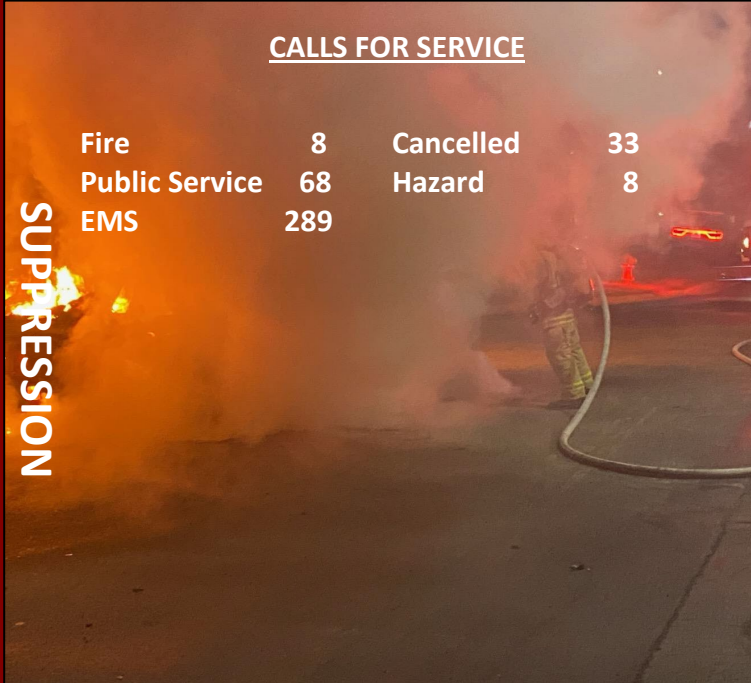

Vehicle Fire

2/5/2026

A-Shift was dispatched to a vehicle fire on M59 and I75. Dispatch reported that this was a multi-vehicle accident, with one vehicle flipped and on fire and two people trapped. Upon arrival, Auburn Hills police reported all passengers were safely out of the vehicle.

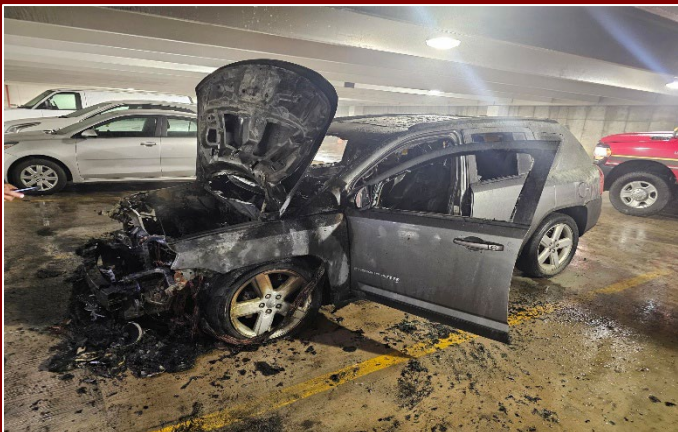


Engine 3 was able to successfully extinguish the fire with approximately 500 gallons of water and foam. 3 patients were treated and transported to local hospitals by Rescue 1 and Rescue 2.

Vehicle Fire

2/20/2026

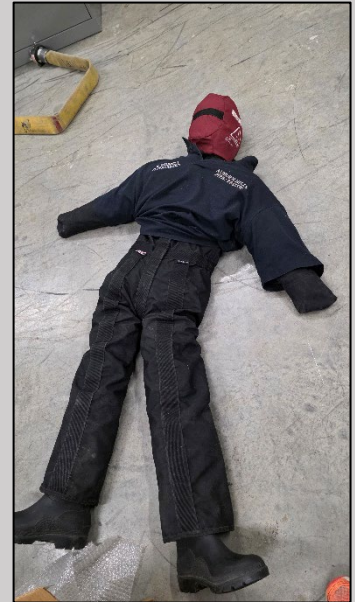
B-shift was toned for a vehicle fire in a lower-level parking structure. Engine 3 arrived on scene to stretch a hose line down a stairwell to the lower level, allowing the firefighters to completely extinguish the fire. The fire was in a vehicle located two floors below grade with heavy smoke conditions, making it extremely difficult to find the fire. There were no vehicles parked next to the involved car, so no damage noted to other vehicles. The parking structure ceiling sustained minimal smoke damage.



A Shift Training

2/23/2026

A-shift has been working on search and rescue training during the month of February. The training involves searching a room for a manikin and bringing the “victim” to safety. The final sign off for probationary members was to search a dark room for the live “victim” in the basement and carry him upstairs and to fresh air. The lieutenant bravely played the victim in the final scenario and was successfully rescued from the “fire”.



Hotel Inspections

Approximately 3 years ago, the city of Auburn Hills implemented a comprehensive hotel inspection plan to ensure hotels were meeting expectations for safety and compliance. Since that time, hotels across the city are in better condition than they were three years ago. Joint efforts between the Police Department, Community Development and the Fire Department have produced positive results. Through diligent inspections and follow-up visits, violations have decreased and hotels are better equipped to serve visitors to our city. Annual inspections begin in late August and establishments that fail to comply are brought before the City Council for licensure review.
