5/01/2026

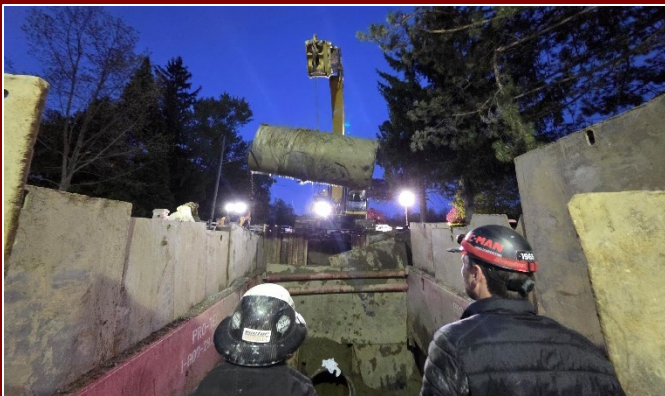

Water Main Break

5/10/2026



In the early morning of May 10th, Auburn Hills experienced a major water main break affecting not only our city, but our neighboring communities, as well. Residents were instructed to boil water and urged to use water only for emergency purposes, restaurants were closed and many businesses shut down. Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) immediately began repairs on the line and set up (CONT~)

distribution centers for potable water. A State of Emergency was declared, and updates were shared on social media. The break was repaired and boil water advisories were lifted on May 16.

Structure Fire

5/14/2026

C-shift was called to the scene of a house fire on Bald Mountain Road. Upon arrival, crews found a fully involved fire, spreading across the garage and entire front of the home. A car parked in front of the garage was also involved. Four handlines were directed at the blaze, and once the fire was under control, crews made their way into the home to continue extinguishment.



Assistance was provided from Orion Township, Rochester Hills, and Oakland Township fire departments. All residents were able to escape and only one minor injury was reported to an Auburn Hills firefighter. Investigations revealed the origin of the fire was the garage and the cause is undetermined.
