AHFD is excited to add Zach to the department and wishes him well in his career!

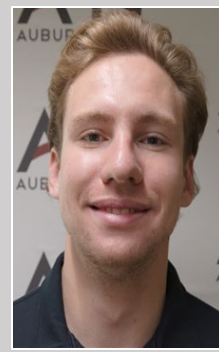
New Hires

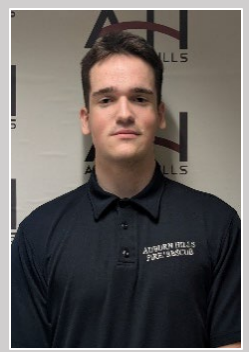
